Google: did you know that you could find sites' reading levels when you do an advanced search with Google?

Click the advanced search button to the right of the search box, and then select your preference under "Need more tools?"

Google will display all reading levels, or only return results at the level you specify depending on your preference.

# Slow Internet? Plug it in!

One of the things we hear about most often is that the Internet is slow. Although this could be caused by many factors, one of the easiest and most effective solutions is to always use an Ethernet cable for your teacher machine whenever possible.

This does a couple of things: -Reduces the number of people using the wireless hubs, which speeds up the connection for everyone using that hub -Gives you the fastest possible connection without the possibility of interference.

A number of factors influence the speed of the wireless connections, the biggest one being the number of people using a single hub. Think of the hub as a pizza; each person who decides to use that pizza makes everyone else get a smaller slice.

Larry will be experimenting with using more hubs to see if that resolves the problem in notoriously slow spots, but until then, your best bet is to make sure you are using a wired connection.

If you are still having a slow Internet experience, it may be due to other issues with your computer.
