Getting Started:

1. Start Slow and Low

- •Start slow-don't try to do too much at once. Plug in one or two 21st Century Themes that lend themselves well.
- •Start Low-start with something students usually have a difficult time learning; you have nothing to lose.

2. Get More Creative


- •Involve students in coming up with creative ideas to demonstrate learning. What could they create? For who or what purpose? Their interests and abilities could lead to some great work!
- ·Add restrictions to projects. Creating confines within which students must create causes them to think more deeply about subject matter, and promotes problem-solving skills.

3. Make it Authentic

- ·Why are we learning this? If there is a good real-world example, mimic it.
- •Find a meaningful or useful application for the new learning: is there a problem that this would help solve? Can we create something that someone could use?

4. Collaborate

- ·Who else would benefit from this learning? Can we involve them?
- ·Are there community, school, or professional partnerships that I could develop to help foster this learning?
